Health Policy Differences Between Candidates Based on Prior Administrations

- Biden-Harris Administration: Emphasizes expanding and protecting health coverage through the Affordable Care Act (ACA) and Medicaid. Their policies include addressing racial disparities, supporting reproductive rights, reducing prescription drug costs, and strengthening health equity initiatives.
- Trump Administration: Previously focused on repealing the ACA, cutting
 Medicaid funding, and introducing policies that could limit access to affordable
 healthcare, especially for marginalized groups. Trump's stance on reproductive
 health is aligned with allowing states to impose restrictions.

Impact Across Different Levels of Government

- The election's outcome will influence federal, state, and local health policies, with implications for Medicaid, reproductive rights, immigrant health, and LGBTQ health.
- Potential changes in health equity could result in either expanding or retracting rights and access to services, significantly affecting marginalized communities.

Emerging Anti-DEI Legislation

- There's a growing trend of legislation aimed at restricting diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) programs. Such laws can hinder health equity efforts by limiting discussions around social determinants of health.
- Some states have broadly interpreted these laws to avoid addressing health equity topics altogether, even where laws don't explicitly prohibit such initiatives.

Call to Action for Public Health and Health Equity Advocates

- Engagement and Advocacy: Encouraged to remain informed, advocate for health equity policies, and participate in nonpartisan efforts to raise awareness about the election's impact on health.
- Leveraging Data and Community Knowledge: Use data to demonstrate the benefits of health equity policies and engage communities in decision-making to ensure solutions address real needs.

Themes Highlighted by Speakers

- The urgency of health equity, with a focus on issues like Medicaid, reproductive health, immigrant wellbeing, and legal challenges to health equity programs.
- A shared sense of hope based on historical progress and current grassroots efforts, especially efforts for change that are being led by the younger generation of leaders.
